ALL Employees/Volunteers* (anyone who volunteers in <u>any</u> capacity with children or vulnerable adults for the Parish):

- 1. Sign the Volunteer Code of Conduct (Completed by employee/volunteer through VIRTUS[®] registration process.
- 2. Complete a background check through S2Verify (Can be completed through VIRTUS[®] registration process, re-run every 5-years).
- 3. Complete VIRTUS Online training "<u>Protecting God's Children® Online Awareness Session 3.0</u>" offered in English and Spanish (recertify every 5-years).

Whom should read monthly VIRTUS[®] training bulletins (This is not meant to be an inclusive list.)

- Priests
- Deacons
- Seminarians
- Parish Administrators
- ALL School Employees (Head Coaches paid or unpaid)
- Faith Formation Directors
- Youth Ministers
- Choir Director
- Altar Server Coordinator

- The head maintenance person because they would be the one locking up (and could be a key person to keep our facilities safe from any sexual predators).

Listing of those mandated to take VIRTUS[®] training. (This is not meant as an inclusive list.)

- * Choir Director
- * Altar Server Coordinator
- * Scout Leaders Boys, Girls, Campfire
- * Religious Education (catechists, assistants, hall monitors, food prepares, etc.)

- * ALL School Volunteers Room Parents, Office Volunteers
- * Field Trip Chaperones & Drivers (even if for one event)

- * Part-time or Supply Clergy
- * Athletic Directors, Coaches and Assistants
- * Knights of Columbus (this requirement is in their National rules)
