

Periods

PERIOD OF EVANGELIZATION AND PRECATECHUMENATE

A time of inquiry.




- Opportunity for the beginnings of faith.
- At this stage, you, the Inquirer have been moved by the Holy Spirit to inquire about the Catholic faith, but you may still be deciding on officially entering the RCIA process.
- There is no fixed duration or structure to this time of inquiry.
- You may have been inquiring for years by the time you have decided to come to RCIA sessions.

RITE OF ACCEPTANCE/RITE OF WELCOME

- Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens
 - Candidates express and the Church accepts their intention to respond to God's call to follow the way of Christ.
- Rite of Welcome

Those who have been baptized are welcomed into the community and acknowledge

themselves to be part of it.



MOVING FORWARD ⇒



Time to make a decision:

- Am I still attracted by the Catholic faith?
- Do I want to continue this journey of faith?
- Am I ready to celebrate this Rite and move forward?

It should not be done too early, but should be delayed until the candidates, according to their own dispositions and situation, have had sufficient time to conceive an initial faith and to show the first signs of conversion.

CATECHUMENATE

Nurturing and growth of faith and conversion to God.



- Spiritual and Catechetical Formation
- Deeper Exploration of the Faith
- Once you are accepted into the Order of Catechumens, you are referred to as a Catechumen.
- Or, if have been baptized in another church, you are referred to as a Candidate after the Rite of Welcome.

RITE OF ELECTION/ENROLLMENT OF NAMES CALL TO CONTINUING CONVERSION


 During the Rite of Election, the Church formally ratifies the catechumens' readiness for the sacraments of initiation. By enrolling your name, you, the *Elect*, express the will to receive the sacraments.



- During the Call to Continuing
 Conversion, candidates are recognized and affirmed by the Church.
- These rites normally occur with the start of the liturgical season of Lent and initiate the Period of Purification and Enlightenment.

PURIFICATION AND ENLIGHTENMENT

Preparation to Receive the Sacraments



- This time coincides with the liturgical season of Lent.
- It is a period of reflection, intensely centered on conversion.
- Liturgical Rites belonging to this period:
 - Scrutinies are rites of selfsearching and repentance which are prayed over the elect usually on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent to prepare one for the sacraments of initiation.
 - The Penitential Rite marks the Lenten purification of baptized adults.


CELEBRATION OF THE

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

The Elect are initiated through baptism, confirmation and the eucharist at the Easter Vigil Mass.

❖ Candidates for full Reception into the Catholic Church will make a profession of faith in which they were baptized, receive the sacrament of confirmation

and take part in the eucharist.







 Mystagogy includes a lifelong growing in the faith.




